


With the help of this decision tree you will be able to determine whether or not you are allowed to go to school and/or work.

Before you start please note:

1. This decision tree is based on people with normal health, without any underlying medical conditions.
2. **Always start with the first question** and follow the questions in the prescribed sequence.
3. Do not just look at one or two separate questions; this may lead to an incorrect result.
4. The outcome of the decision tree is not valid for other members of the household; the decision tree needs to be followed separately for each individual.
5. This decision tree is regularly updated on the basis of new or renewed regulations. Please check the most recent version on <https://ajnjeugdartsen.nl>.
6. A Dutch version is also available.
7. There is also a decision tree for children aged 0 up to and including children in group 8 of primary school. Please check the most recent version on boink.info/beslisboom.

1.5 METRES DISTANCE?

Pupils, students and adults should all maintain a distance of 1.5 metres from each other. It is up to the schools to decide how they can accommodate this rule in the classrooms.



**** WHICH CONTACT CATEGORY?**

- Category 1 : **members of the household**
- Category 2: **other close contacts** (having spent more than 15 minutes within 1.5 metres of a covid patient). This may also include a complete group (childcare) or class (school). This will be decided by the GGD (Municipal Health Services) on a case to case basis.
- Category 3: other non-close contacts

WHEN SHOULD YOU BE TESTED?

- If you have any symptoms fitting COVID-19
- If you have been in contact with person diagnosed with COVID-19. So if you have an indication as a result of source and contact tracing or because of a notification of the coronavirus alert app, please get tested as soon as possible as a member of the household or a close contact**. Also get tested from day 5 after the last contact with someone suffering from the coronavirus. This goes for members of the household, close and casual contacts.
- If testing is advised by the GGD (for example in case of an outbreak investigation).
- After 5 days after you come from an area abroad with an orange/red travel advisory.
- If you are seriously ill.

See the adjacent text box to check how long you should stay at home.

Testing can never be made compulsory.

HOW LONG SHOULD YOU STAY AT HOME?

- Until test results are known. if you have been tested because you have been in contact with category 3**, then you do not need to stay at home while awaiting the test result if you do not have any symptoms.
- Until the end of the quarantine period set by the GGD (Municipal Health Service). How long this will take and what the rules are depends on the situation. Follow the advice of the GGD.

TEST RESULTS

In all cases, follow the advice of the GGD (Municipal Health Services). Generally applies:

Positive
Yes, you or a member of your household have been infected with the corona virus. Follow the instructions of the GGD.

Negative
No, you have not been infected with the corona virus. You are allowed to go to school or work again, even if not all symptoms have disappeared yet. Unless you are still in a quarantine period set by the GGD.

This decision tree has been developed on the basis of directives of the RIVM (National Institute for Public Health and the Environment). It is a guideline for all students in secondary education (about the age of 12), students in secondary vocational education and higher education, working youth and adult.
